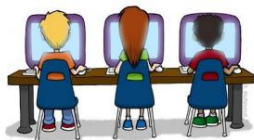

GOALS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

SCHOOL GOALS- Students join with BME staff and parents/guardians in creating goals for themselves for the school year.

Goals:

- 1) BME students in grades PK-2 will meet performance levels set by the state in all subjects.
- 2) BME students in grades 3-6 will pass the STAAR Math test at or above performance levels set by the state.

Grade 5 students will pass the STAAR Science test at or above performance levels set by the state.
- 3) BME students in grades 3-6 will pass the STAAR Reading Language Arts test at or above performance levels set by the state.
- 3) BME students in grades PK-2 will improve their reading fluency and comprehension by at least one grade level each year.
